## Caramel Apple Craft

These caramel apples are absolutely adorable and so fun and easy to make! Careful...they look good enough to eat!

#### Materials:

Apple template (included)

8.5xll Cardstock/construction paper (red, green, yellow)

Popsicle stick

Googly eyes (optional)

Sprinkles

Glue

Brown food coloring (or mix red, yellow, and blue)
Paint brush
Paper plates
Tape
Black pen/marker



#### Instructions:


1. Print the apple template, either directly onto cardstock paper (red, green, yellow) - or print and cut the template, trace onto desired color of construction paper, and cut out colored apple.

2. Flip the apple upside down and tape popsicle stick to the back of the

apple.

3. On a paper plate,

squeeze a large pile of glue and carefully stir in brown food coloring with the tip of a paintbrush. Play around with the color as necessary to achieve the desired color - a light, caramel color, or a deep chocolate color (mixtures of red, yellow, and blue make brown).





- 4. Use a brush to heavily/thickly paint the brown glue onto the bottom portion of the apple.

  5. Sprinkle the wet glue with sprinkles! Allow to dry.
  - 6. Glue on google eyes (or draw some with a black marker).
    - 7. Draw a smile.










### Directions:


- 1. Take sliced apples and place them on a plate.


## Apple Read-Afouds for Kids




