Thanksgiving Praying Hands

This cute little project can serve as a fun placemat decoration for Thanksqiving, while doubling as a keepsake of your child's handprints. So special!

Materials:

Cardstock/sheets of foam (any color) Thanksgiving phrase "stickers" Glue stick Pencil Scissors




Instructions:

1. Fold a piece of cardstock in half (unless using foam) and trace the hand (all fingers close together, not spread apart); cut out so that you now have two hands (remember to level off the wrist with a


straight line).

2. Use the glue stick to glue the fingertips of the two hands together.



3. Print out the included labels onto regular paper or cardstock (or decorate each side of the praying hands in

whatever way desired).







4. Cut out the matching phrase you want to use on your hands.5. Glue one "sticker" onto each side of the hands.6. Pull apart/fold down the base and set on the table.








Thanksgiving Party Mix



Ingredients:

10 oz almond bark melting chocolate - white and chocolate

Directions:

- 1. In a large bowl, combine pretzels, 1/2 cup nuts, and 1/2 cup cranberries
- 2. In another bowl, follow the directions on package for melting 2 blocks of white chocolate in the microwave.
 - 3. Pour and gently stir into large bowl of ingredients; a light covering is desired.
 - 4. Spread onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
 - 5. Melt chocolate flavored melting chocolate, starting with 2 blocks.
 - 6. Use a fork to drizzle chocolate over party mix.
 - 7. Layer more nuts/cranberries and drizzle more chocolate.
 - 8. Sprinkle salt and cinnamon sugar over entire mix while chocolate is still wet.
 - 9. Allow to cool and harden, 15-30 minutes.
 - 10. Break apart, place in clean bowl, and serve!






